New solar system

Last week, the completion of one of the largest pitched roof solar electric systems in New Jersey was celebrated at Fellowship Village Retirement Community in the Basking Ridge section of Bernards. The panels, installed by Millstone-based Absolutely Energized Solar, are expected to reduce 900,000 pounds of carbon dioxide

each year and protect more than 250 acres of trees annually.

Fellowship Village is a nonprofit continuing care retirement community that offers independent living, assisted living, nursing and rehabilitation, and respite care. The 668-kilowatt solar electric system at Fellowship Village includes more than 3,000 solar panels and covers more than 40 percent of
